Fallbrook Film Factory and Divine Trinity Films Prepare to Premiere their Largest Production: "My Necklace, Myself"

Fallbrook, CA – June 11, 2008 – The Fallbrook Film Factory, in association with Divine Trinity Films, will be premiering their newest film, *My Necklace, Myself*, to audiences on July 11, 2008 in Temecula, CA. At forty-one minutes, the film, about a young girl who searches for her true self with the help of a magical necklace, is the largest film either company has produced. It required a team of two-dozen crewmembers, three large locations, and over one hundred extras to complete.

On July 11, 2008, the film will premiere at the Temeku Theater in Temecula California at 7:00 p.m., to be followed by a Q&A with some of the stars and crew of the film. It is open to the general public, although tickets are limited. As a fundraiser for filmmaking equipment for the Fallbrook Film Factory, and to allow everyone the chance to see this extraordinary film come to life on the big screen, two additional showings for the film will play at 7:00 and 8:00 p.m. on July 12, 2008. After the premiere, the film will begin rounds throughout the festival circuit and seek distribution on DVD.

The Fallbrook Film Factory is a not-for-profit consortium created to bring a serious filmmaking capability to creative people who would like to write, act, produce and direct films. The two-year-old company has produced several short films, documentaries to support the community and music videos, but their aspiration has been to make dramatic features. Backed by Technical Differences, Inc., makers of People-Trak Software located in Bonsall, California, and based upon a script written by Bryan Caron, aspiring screenwriter with many credits, *My Necklace Myself* was put into production.

With a modest budget of \$15,000, *My Necklace, Myself* went into a four-month pre-production before rolling cameras in January, 2008. Working weekends in Fallbrook and Oceanside, California, the cast and crew worked throughout the next two months, dealing with extreme temperature changes, a flu bug, recasting and rain.

Alongside Fallbrook residents Julia Witschger and Christiana Minga (Resurrection Mary), the cast includes Derek Majewski, Norman Black (Veronica Mars, Desire, Watch Over Me), Deanna Lynn Walsh (The Parallel, Untold Stories of the ER), and Samantha Valencia (Resurrection Mary, Zoey 101) in supporting roles. "The cast worked wonderfully together," says writer/director Bryan Caron. "Even when we had to replace Samantha due to a sudden and serious illness, a friend of Derek's [Hanna Vojak] stepped in as if she had had the part from the beginning. And it worked out for Samantha, too, as I was able to write her a brand new part that fit her perfectly."

Filming on *My Necklace, Myself* wrapped at the end of February, and it has been a long three months in the editing room for Bryan Caron, who enjoys every minute of it. "I love it. Time literally flies when I'm in front of that computer figuring out the best way to create a scene. It really is magic to see it all coming together." In addition to the film, a music video, from a song inspired by Bryan Caron, will accompany the film during the closing credits.

"*My Necklace, Myself* has a strong message for kids and teens, alike," said director of photography and Film Factory Founder Ronald Shattuck. "Families can come and enjoy the film together without having to worry about exposing their kids to violence, sex or language, and at the same time have fun and have something to talk about afterward."
